



Spring is in the Air

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Notes:

Stitches used are detached chain stitch (lazy daisy), feather stitch, French knots, satin stitch and split stitch.

If you are unfamiliar with working any of these stitches, then I recommend you visit the Royal School of Needlework Stitch Wall where there are full instructions, including video

Shown mounted in 9" hoop.

Design worked on soft dark neutral linen from Wild Linens




Materials

- 12" square of fabric suitable for embroidery, ie non-stretchy. I used a pure linen fabric in Dark Neutral from Wild Linens (UK based)
- DMC stranded cotton floss in colours 16, 310, 704, 742, 744, 792, 813, 904, 3713, 3865, 4320
- 9" hoop

Method

Use two strands of floss throughout

- Iron your background fabric well before beginning.
- Stitch design in accordance with guide on following pages.
- When finished press lightly on the reverse being very careful not to flatten your stitches and mount in hoop for display.





Stitching Guide

- Transfer the pattern to the centre of your fabric and work in the colours given above. The stitches used are as follows and you will see that the flower/foliage elements are repeated around the hoop. Instructions are only given once, but all elements of that type are stitched in the same way.
- A is a cluster of large (3 twist) French knots
- B is a central line of backstitch with detached chain stitches worked on either side.
- C the petals are split stitch and the centre is a cluster of tiny (single twist) French knots. To work split stitch using two strands of floss simply insert your needle between the strands "splitting" the width of the thread in two equally.

- D the stem is stem stitch and the flowers are satin stitch.
- E the petals are split stitch and the centre is a cluster of tiny French knots.
- F is feather stitch
- G, and all the other long thin leaves, whether worked in the darker or lighter green are satin stitch worked on the diagonal.
- H has stem stitch stems and satin stitch flowers
- J also has stem stitch stems and satin stitch flowers.

Pattern is full size and reversed to suit your preferred method of transfer.
